

Pima Fairgrounds ...

to American Legion at 5845 E 22 Street – 8 miles – 17 minute drive
to Elks Lodge on 1800 N Oracle Rd – 6 miles – 13 minute drive

to San Xavier del Bac Mission – 7 miles – 14 minute drive

A Stop at San Xavier Mission built when Southern Arizona was still a part of Spanish Territory. Visit the spectacular Church and wander into the open-air Tohono O'odam Indian Shops scattered around the Mission and shop the collection of Indian art and novelties.

“Old Tucson”- 201 S. Kinney Road, Tucson, AZ- 28 miles- 36 minute drive

Built in 1939, Old Tucson is a renowned film set and family theme park located just outside Tucson, Az. Nestled between Saguaro National Park and Tucson Mountain Park, this beautiful desert setting has been the filming location of hundreds of classic western films and TV Shows. The studio opened its doors as a theme park in 1960 and continues to welcome guests for a variety of immersive experiences, and tours. A uniquely western experience. General Admission \$17

to Tombstone – 69 miles – 1 hour 12 minute drive

Stroll along the sidewalks of Tombstone, home of the OK Corral, Wyatt Earp and Doc Holiday. Have a cold one at Big Nose Kate's Saloon and take a ride on Tombstone's stagecoach. (Additional fees for some attractions: “Good Enough Mine Tour” \$20, Courthouse tour \$7, Bird Cage Brothel Tour \$15, Gun Fight Show \$10). Plenty of restaurants and saloons here.

to Bisbee – 92 miles – 1 hour 34 minute drive

Hit the shopping district of Bisbee for unique antiques and collectibles, stop to take photographs in the well-preserved 1902 Copper Queen Hotel, and take in the sights of Tombstone, home to legends like Wyatt Earp and Doc Holiday.

to Asarco Mineral Discovery Center/ Copper Mine Tours - 23 miles- 30 minutes

1421 W. Pima Mine Rd Sahuarita AZ (I-19 exit 80)

Copper is a primary metal used in hospitals, electricity, tools and electricity.

Take a free self-guided tour of the center that walks through the copper transformation process. Then join a mine tour and afterwards visit the Company Store.

to Titan Missile Museum – 23 miles- 31 minutes

Last tour at 4 p.m. The Titan Missile Museum is the only publicly accessible Titan II missile site in the nation. At this National Historic Landmark site, visitors stand on the front line of the Cold War. Tour the underground missile site. See the three-ton blast doors, the eight-foot-thick silo walls, and an actual Titan II missile in the launch duct. Visit the launch control center, experience a simulated launch and more! Go down in history at the Titan Missile Museum!
